B. Executive Secretary Report

VI. EMPLOYEE SERVICE AWARDS

Chuck McCampbell – 15 Years – The work of Chuck, and those that he directs, enables our agency to do our work. Among other responsibilities, she assists the entire Workforce Development staff and others in Transition to Teaching grant management, educator recruitment activities and events, the TeachGeorgia.org, educator recruitment and job posting web site, Workforce Development business processes, educator job fairs and other event planning and coordination. Importantly, Gayle works closely with director Cyndy Stephens and others to collaborate with RESAs, school systems, and other PSC-approved non-traditional and MAT programs for the annual distribution, use and reporting of funds in Transition to Teaching financial stipends that offset the cost of preparation for eligible nontraditional teacher candidates statewide.
